

ADDITION TO THE CO-RESPONSIBILITY EDUCATIONAL AGREEMENT

Health and integrated digital education outlines

Given the Ministerial Decree of MIUR 26 June 2020 n. 39, containing "*Adoption of the document for the planning of school, educational and training activities in all institutions of the national education system for the school year 2020/2021*";

Having regard to the Technical Document prepared by the Technical Scientific Committee (CTS) established at the Department of Civil Protection, containing the "*Hypothesis of remodeling of the containment measures in the school sector and the methods of resuming teaching activities for the next school year*", approved on 28 May 2020 and attached to the aforementioned Ministerial Decree;

Given, also, the minutes of the CTS dated 22 June 2020 n. 90, on 7 July 2020 n. 94, on 10 August 2020 n. 100, with which the Technical Scientific Committee has, on the one hand, clarified some points of the aforementioned document for the planning of school activities in view of the resumption of lessons from September 2020 and, on the other hand, has indicated new measures for the reduction of the risk of infection by SARS-COV-2 in the school environment;

Given the Report of the National Institute of Health (ISS) COVID-19 dated 21 August 2020 no. 58, containing "*Operational guidelines for the management of cases and outbreaks of SARS-COV-2 in schools and childhood education services*";

Given that the D.M. n. 39/2020 has required educational institutions, among other things,

➤ to reorganize the spaces in order to guarantee the maintenance of the physical distance (understood as 1 metre between the mouth of the pupils and 2 metres between pupils and teachers);

➤ to arrange routes inside school buildings in order to avoid gatherings;

- to establish, again for the purposes referred to in the previous point, the modalities of access and exit of pupils and teaching staff, differentiating the relative timetables for groups of classes;
- where necessary, to reshape the weekly school time;
- to provide for the sanitation of school premises;

Also acknowledged that the Technical-Scientific Committee has repeatedly reiterated that "the precondition for the presence at the school of students and all the staff working in various capacities is:

- the absence of respiratory symptoms or body temperature above 37.5 ° C, even in the previous three days;
- have not been in quarantine or home isolation in the past 14 days;
- not having been in contact with positive people, as far as they know, in last 14 days;

Considering that the "Via della Commenda" State Comprehensive Institute, in compliance with the aforementioned Ministerial Decree n. 39/2020 and to the aforementioned documents of the Scientific Technical Committee, has adopted all the provided precautionary measures to reduce the risk of contagion from SARS-COV-2 and that it will adopt all further measures that will be indicated by the competent Authorities;

Pointing out that the respect by pupils, families and all school staff of the measures adopted and adopted by the Institute Management is an indispensable condition for the correct and peaceful development of the 2020/2021 school year;

Considering that, for the purposes of the preceding point, it is indispensable an active collaboration of students and families who will have to put into practice the general behaviours envisaged to combat the spread of the epidemic and that, therefore, it is necessary to update the Co-responsibility educational agreement.

Given also the so-called Guidelines for Integrated Digital Education, with which the Ministry of Education has given indications for the design of the School Plan for Integrated Digital Teaching (DDI) to be adopted by all educational institutions of any grade, should the need arise, containment of the contagion, as well as if it were necessary

to suspend again the teaching activities in presence due to the contingent epidemiological conditions;

Noting that said Guidelines provide that the Schools:

- start a survey of the need for technological instrumentation;
- approve the criteria for granting on loan for use of the instrumental equipment of the educational institution, taking care that they contemplate a priority towards less well-off students, through the definition of transparent award criteria in compliance with the regulations on the protection of personal data;
- supplement the Institute Regulations with specific provisions regarding the rules of conduct to be followed during connections by all members of the school community in relation to respect for others, sharing of documents and data protection;
- ensure, in the case of digital activities complementary to the face-to-face one, that the group following the remote activity respects the entire working hours of the class, unless the planning of a different time frame of teaching, between pupils in presence and at a distance, do not find their reasons in the specificity of the methodology in use;
- ensure, in the event that the DDI becomes the sole instrument for carrying out the school service, following any new lockdown situations, or closure of the school or quarantine of the class group, with regard to primary school and lower secondary school, at least fifteen hours a week of teaching in synchronous mode with the entire class group (ten hours for the first classes of primary school), also organized in a flexible way, in which to build disciplinary and interdisciplinary paths, with the possibility of providing further activities in small group, as well as proposals in asynchronous mode according to the methods considered most suitable;
- facilitate the school-family relationship through formal information and sharing activities of the project proposal of integrated digital teaching with regard to both the hours of activities to allow them the best organization, and with regard to the sharing of educational approaches, even training materials, to support the learning path of those pupils with particular frailties who need, in DDI, the support of an adult to take advantage of the proposed activities;

- finally insert in the educational co-responsibility pact, a specific appendix referring to the mutual commitments to be assumed for the completion of integrated digital teaching;
Having said and considered that, the Educational Co-responsibility Pact in force is updated and integrated as follows.

A) HEALTH SECTION

The School Direction undertakes to:

- issue and publish on the Institute's website one or more circulars to illustrate to teachers, ATA staff, pupils and families all the measures adopted in compliance with the Ministerial Decree n. 39/2020 and to the CTS documents (for example: staggering entrances and exits, preparation of internal routes in school buildings, school time reshaping) and rules of conduct to which they must comply, as well as to issue and publish on the same website one or more circulars to illustrate any further measures and / or rules of conduct, which will be adopted in compliance with any further measures taken by the MIUR - and / or the Government - and by the Technical Scientific Committee;

The General and Administrative Services Management undertakes to:

- take all necessary measures to ensure the sanitation of school buildings whenever necessary, also based on the requirements of the ATS, as well as the daily cleaning by ATA staff of all school premises and in particular the toilets.

Teachers undertake to:

- respect and execute the circulars referred to in the previous point;
- explain to the pupils the reasons why and what they need to respect during the stay in school, all precautionary measures to reduce the risk of contagion from SARS-COV-2;
- ensure that the pupils - during their stay in the classroom and, in general, in the school building - respect the rules on distancing and avoid gatherings, during the intervals and during the phases of entry and exit;
- ensure that the pupils, during their stay in school buildings, use PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) in the manner that will be established by the MIUR - and / or the Government - and by the CTS;

Parents undertake to:

- respect and ensure that your child respects the circulars that will be issued by the School Management;
- explain to your child why it is necessary to strictly comply with all precautionary measures - including the use of PPE while staying in school buildings - aimed at reducing the risk of contagion from SARS-COV-2;
- respect and ensure that your child respects, rigorously and without delay, the entrance times to school buildings, as provided in the School Plan drawn up by the School Management and as it will be brought to the attention of parents and pupils by means of the aforementioned circulars;
- measure your child's temperature every morning;
- do not send your child to school, if the child:
 - presents respiratory symptoms or body temperature above 37.5 ° C, even in the previous three days;
 - has been in quarantine or home isolation in the past 14 days;
 - has been in contact with SARS-COV-2 positive people, on their own acquaintance, in the last 14 days;
- if your child has an increase in body temperature above 37.5 ° C or respiratory symptoms, inform the family pediatrician / general practitioner for the clinical evaluation of the case and notify the School Management of the absence for health reasons. If their child is subjected to a swab with a positive result, parents must promptly notify the School Management, so that it can adopt the consequent necessary measures;
- go to school without delay and / or as soon as possible, if called by the Institute because your child has a fever with a temperature above 37.5° C and contact family pediatrician / general practitioner for the clinical evaluation of the case. If the child is subjected to a swab with positive results, parents must promptly notify the School Management, so that it adopts the consequent necessary measures;
- provide your child with a surgical or cloth mask for their entry to school;

- wear a mask or other suitable PPE during delivery and collection of the child to/from school;

Students undertake to:

- respect the circulars that will be issued by the school management;
- respect the rules on physical spacing during the stay in the school premises, avoiding gatherings during breaks, moving around the buildings and in the phases of entry and exit from them and follow the paths assigned;
- when entering the school building (and / or in the primary school yard area) wear a surgical mask or one's own cloth, as well as wear in the classroom (in this case only when not sitting at one's desk), in the corridors , in the toilets, in the courtyard areas and in general, in all the places of the school, the surgical mask, which, once it is provided by the Ministry of Education to the Institute, will be delivered to them in their respective classrooms. Until the Ministry of Education has provided the Institute with the daily surgical masks provided, the pupils will also wear their own surgical or fabric masks inside the school buildings;
- strictly respect the entrance times, as established in the School Plan by the School Management and brought to their attention through the circulars referred to in the previous points;
- promptly communicate any feelings of discomfort and / or increase in body temperature to the teacher on duty.

B) INTEGRATED DIGITAL EDUCATIONAL SECTION

The School Direction undertakes to:

- adopt every suitable measure to make integrated digital teaching practical and operational, both in the form of mixed teaching and in that of teaching in synchronous mode with the entire class group, as a virtual "movement" of the teaching and learning environment and, so to speak, the legal environment in the presence;
- issue and publish on the Institute's website one or more circulars to inform families about the project proposal for integrated digital teaching and about its concrete implementation;

- issue and publish on the Institute's website one or more circulars to inform families and pupils about the correct use of IT tools in the event of DDI, any consequences, including criminal ones, regarding their incorrect use and the obligations deriving from them from the legislation on privacy.

Teachers undertake to:

- to set the criteria and methods for delivering integrated digital teaching in the combination of activities in synchronous and asynchronous mode, in order to optimize the teaching offer and adapt it to the learning rhythms of the pupils;
- if this is dictated by health needs, to carry out the DDI in the form of mixed teaching ensuring that the group following the remote activity fully respects the working hours of the class;
- in the case of quarantine or isolation of one or more pupils, carry out the DDI in the form of the mixed;
- in case of lockdown, closure of the school, quarantine of the class group, carry out the DDI ensuring a minimum of ten hours a week of teaching in synchronous mode for the entire class group with regard to the first classes of primary and a minimum of 15 weekly hours in synchronous mode with the entire class group for all other primary school classes and all secondary school classes, and to also carry out lessons in asynchronous mode according to the methodologies deemed most suitable.

Students undertake to:

- respect the circulars that will be adopted by the School Management and in particular the rules of conduct that will be referred to therein also with reference to the legislation on privacy;
- respect teachers and classmates during DDI classes and therefore not to engage in conduct that is detrimental to honor and decorum, as well as the privacy of teachers and classmates;
- follow all the lessons that will be given in DDI, with the exception of the case of illness, carefully, in a polite manner and without assuming any conduct that could hinder

the orderly development of the same, and participating with the same rigor to be held during the lessons in presence;

- always remain in video connection during the lessons carried out in DDI;
- carry out all the homework assigned also in DDI and return on time, respecting the due dates by the teachers.
- carry out all the tests assigned without using other IT and / or paper tools;

Parents undertake to:

- explain to your child that DDI is a teaching method like that in the presence, characterized by the simple movement of the teaching and learning environment in virtual mode;
- explain to your child the correct use of IT tools and the risks associated with their incorrect use;
- ensure that your child respects the circulars issued by the School Management with regard to DDI and always maintains a behaviour appropriate to the lessons.
